Playground – Swing Time and District reps came out last week – District prefers Helium over Nova, District will pay for all the ground prep so CDG PAC will just have to pay for equipment – we have enough for Helium right now – Swing Time said they can install by end of March but district needs until Summer; prices are locked in until August

West Play has come back with a quote that is available for 2 weeks but quality is lower and number of kids that can play is lower

District prefers known vendor that has good warranty and prefers Helium

District orders the playground and preps ground and PAC pays the district when the playground is complete
